### **Course Name/Number: Chemistry 1A03**

A discussion of chemical fundamentals, including bonding, structure, reactivity, and energetic, with emphasis on applications to health, energy, and the environment. Laboratories highlight hands-on experimental techniques, tutorials support the development of problem-solving skills.
